

A BEGINNING, A MUDDLE & AN END

You probably know this already, but it bears repeating: everything you see in tonight's show is entirely improvised. Nothing is planned. There are no secret handshakes, no codes, no default scripts. We're flying blind. And when I say 'we', I am of course attempting to steal some of the limelight for myself: in truth, this is all about nine extraordinary performers - some of whom had never done any improvisation before this production - sharing a stage with each other, and spinning a tale out of thin air. It could be comedy, it could be tragic. Nobody knows until it's already told. One thing is clear, however: whatever else improv is, it's about so much more than simply making stuff up on the spot.

This is the third full length production I've directed at the NVT in as many years, and I've always been allowed to be somewhat ridiculous with what I'm doing. "Four Play" had four different actors playing four different parts (and coping with four different endings) while 'Medea' was an attempt at Greek tragedy for audiences that didn't like Greek tragedy - and getting the audience to sit right in the middle of the performance space. And this week, we have a play - more accurately, five plays - in which there is no plot, no idea, no safety nets. In very real terms, it could be a spectacular train crash. Even if the play isn't actually about a spectacular train crash. I say all this not to blow my own trumpet (well, maybe a bit) but just to underline that there is a trumpet, and we all get to gleefully share it in equal measure.

Improvisation, if it's about anything, is about trust, faith, and listening. Surrounding yourself to the very real possibility that the crazy idea that your partner or colleague has might just work. More than that: it might be fantastic. It's a good mentality to carry on into 'real life'. I'm aware that I've spoken about this before but this, too, bears repeating: I'm always somewhat awestruck and humbled by how much faith and trust the NVT puts in its members. Good theatre is about reaching slightly above what you previously considered possible, or even sane. We can do this knowing that we are in a building full of support - from a fantastic group of performers that were always pushing themselves to 100%, to the many people who I don't even see that show their support in a hundred quiet little ways, to the few who my sleep deprived brain has caused me to entirely forget, and may never thank properly. You guys are the best.

And, that cast? I've had the greatest cast on my side in this production. I was determined to try to achieve a genuine 'company' feel: a cast who supported and looked out for each other, working very hard to make everyone else look brilliant. In the end, I needn't have worried - that achievement is entirely theirs, without my interference. I merely blow the trumpet.

Andrew is a sometime director, writer and actor. He has tended to play the brooding failed writer in love with a woman he can't have, which is the sort of typecasting that's quite pleasing or depressing, depending on your outlook. For the NVT, he has previously produced 'Medea' and 'Four Play' (his own script), and runs weekly improv workshops, every Sunday night, at the DukeBox Theatre in Hove.
