# **BENEFACTORS**

What do you want? What does anybody want?
"Nice little semis with nice little gardens." But David cannot build the people of Basuto Road "nice little semis" as he needs to provide more housing not less.

The play is ostensibly about creation and destruction. David, an architect wants to build houses, but is beset by problems from all sides. His wife, Jane (an anthropologist) doesn't want to help people, but can't help herself from doing so. In contrast his old college friend, Colin (a journalist) wants the opposite of what everybody else wants and his wife Sheila wants to help people but is an inadver-

The piece was written in 1984 looking back to the late 60's and 70's, and the changes which were happening in society and architecture at the time. It is funny, clever and at times, painful as it wraps up the interactions of these four very different people. The dry, wry humour of this play shows how small actions can escalate into ridiculous extremes!

What is happiness? What is helping? Does anybody really know what they want or what is good for them or anyone else?

This is my first experience of directing at NVT, although I have enjoyed acting here a couple of times and loved seeing many productions over the past 6 years. The space in the studio has always been exciting for me - particularly as someone who has mainly directed in pros arch, so I have chosen to stage this intimate play in the round which is a first for me and some of the cast.

I have been lucky to be joined on this journey of discovery by new members to NVT in the cast and crew. Steven Adams, Carrie Lambe and Jeremy Crow join us onstage at NVT for the first time, plus an old hand, Jen Ley (Bridges) to show us all the ropes! In my crew: Myra Stuart (set design), Samantha Swithinbank (costumes), Nick Lazar (sound operation) and Leigh Ward (stage manager), tempered by great experience with Emma Shiel, Alistair Lock and Deborah Mead and mostly Annique who has done an amazing job on showing us all (mainly me), the way.

We have all had a great time bringing this production together, we hope you have as much fun watching the show.




#### Directed by - Tess Gill

#### Production Manager - Annique Tate-Doe

Annique has been a member of the NVT for nearly two years. Over this time she has been involved in several productions both on and off stage. Previous productions have included; on stage action in 'Heart's Desire' & 'The Snow Queen' and backstage roles as Production Manager - 'The Snow Queen' & Stage Manager - 'Herbal Bed'.

#### Stage Manager - Leigh Ward

Having been a member of the Brighton Little Theatre for nearly 18 years, this is Leigh's first production with the NVT. He has been on stage (and worked off stage) for more productions than he cares to remember!
