Someone shares a secret. Someone can't get a signal. Someone has never felt like this before. Someone remembers everything. Someone is in love. Someone's not ready to talk. Someone can't sleep. Someone's been fired. Someone loves him more than you do.

Written by Caryl Churchill and originally staged at the Royal Court in 2012, the play is a piece of Brechtian Epic Theatre, exploring what it means to love and form relationships in the modern, technological world. In a rapid quick-fire succession of scenes, where the audience are bombarded by information, the play shows a kaleidoscope of snapshot conversations, at times funny, at times, poignant. It explores the private as well as public consequences of living in the digital age, where access to information is both instant and changeable; where we are often socially-isolated in the way we connect with each other and the world. How do we negotiate love within information which is overpowering us every day?

This presents a number of challenges when staging the play, not least creating numerous worlds in which the characters exist. Churchill's language is sparse and some scenes only a few lines long. There is no punctuation, no pauses or character indications, which has created infinite possibilities for interpretation and meaning in rehearsal.

Yet again, I've been blessed by the talented cast I am working with, who have relished these challenges and opportunities. Not only have they been prepared to take creative risks, but they've also been at the heart of the rehearsal process when deciphering the text. We have also frequently utilised modern technology within the rehearsal room, recording and sharing our progress in order to master difficult fragmented dialogue and physical ensemble work. There's been a great sense of camaraderie and I'm very grateful for their humour, generosity and determination.

My design team have also been essential in the creative process, enabling us to tell the myriad stories woven together and to create a world of immediate digital communication. I'm thankful for their great support and problem-solving skills.

I'm proud of what we've crafted together in rehearsals and welcome our audiences into the lives of the many characters we've discovered, shaped and given life to.
