REASONS TO BE PRETTY

"But I don't want a model, I want you!" is not from the play. It is a line that my fifteen year old self thought would be a nice thing for a girl to hear. Shortly after that, the conversation became a blur as I fought to reestablish what I had meant and how I could find the sequence of words which could, in effect, turn back time. The young relationship did not blossom. Whether that episode had anything to do with it is impossible to tell but it is fair to assume it didn't help.

In "Reasons To Be Pretty", Greg endures a similar crisis but in this case, his words do prove to be the catalyst to a very challenging period in his relationship to girlfriend, Steph. Neither of them are able to communicate their feelings terribly well and when put into situations of high stress, they do not articulate a perfectly crafted soundbite like in some Renee Zellweger movie. They argue with confusion and panic like the rest of us and perhaps that is why I like the play so much.

Neil LaBute wrote the comedy to be about our fixation with physical appearance. There is a lot of confrontation in the play and you would be forgiven for thinking, on reading it, that it is an angry play. But we believe that could not be further from the truth. It shows how, in the real world, love is flawed, difficult and often ugly but love is also tender, beautiful and extremely funny.

We are presenting the play in the intimate space of the studio so that whether you side with Greg and feel his pain for saying the wrong thing, or with Steph for believing that, if you love someone, you are incapable of making such a mistake in the first place, the audience is in the thick of the argument.

The cast have proven to be wonderfully creative contributors to the entire process. Fintan, last seen as Hedwig, Pamela, fresh from her fantastic performance in "The Thrill of Love", Scott, a regular NVT performer and recent director of "Richard III" and Jen, from last season's "Benefactors", all bring a wealth of experience and charm to four challenging roles. We also have an incredibly strong backstage team who regularly pop into rehearsals and add to the blend of ideas. Between the script and the team, I am extremely lucky and proud to present this play.

If I can conclude with another quote, this time from someone far more erudite than I, which I feel sums the play up, Shrek in Shrek-The Musical sings, "Beautiful isn't always pretty".

Fintan trained in acting at the Liverpool Institute for Performing Arts. Credits include, 'Surab' in The Caucasian Chalk Circle (Lyric Belfast) 'Charles Bingley' in Pride and Prejudice, 'Davey' in The Lieutenant of Inishmore, The Piper (The Lowry, Manchester), and 'John' in Hard Chair stories (Rose Theatre, London) Credits with NVT include 'Dickie' in The Winslow boy, The Building, and 'Hedwig' in Hedwig and the Angry Inch. Recent film and TV credits include: Cilla, a new self penned online comedy sketch directed by James Newton, The Beach a new web series with Futuresun films, 'Andy' in Coldcall (featured at Film4 Frightfest), 'Rich' in a new feature Angel on the ceiling, 'The halfling Grunmore' in The Shadow of Israphel (City17 productions), a BBC Online pilot comedy series with Greg Davies, The John Lewis 150 years commercial, NBC Movie 24 promo, and Banks of the Foyle Halloween Carnival promotion for the Irish tourist board.



Scott Roberts - Kent

Trained as an actor at Arts Ed, London and worked professionally for a number of years. He most recently performed as Thraso this summer in the Roman play 'The Eunuch', by Terence. The production was staged at the Brighton Open Air Theatre with rave reviews.

His New Venture Theatre credits include: Bob in 'Private Ear' and The Editor/Jason in Headlong's collection of short plays inspired by 9/11, entitled 'Decade'. His first show at the NVT was as the lead role Charlie in 'How to Disappear Completely and Never Be Found', by local award winning writer Fin Kennedy.

This year Scott directed and designed his own adaptation of 'Richard III' and is also a keen writer.





Jen Ley - Carly

Jen has been performing with the NVT since 2007; productions include 'The Interview', 'Intimate Encounters', 'The Real Inspector Hound', 'It's a Wonderful Life', 'Benefactors' and last season's 10 Minute Play Competition. She has also worked with Bitesize Theatre locally, played Laura in the Two Bins production of 'After Party' (both of which won an Argus Angel award) and done rehearsed readings of 'Beef' (Something Underground Theatre Co) and 'WLTM' this September at The Mesmerist. She is currently undertaking small film roles in order to put together a show reel and is in the second year of her counselling diploma-at least one will lead to some paid work in the future!

Tim McQuillen-Wright - Director

At the NVT Tim has directed and designed 'Art', 'Of Mice And Men' and last season's Harold Pinter play 'Celebration'. Tim has also designed 'Biloxi Blues', 'It's A Wonderful Life', 'The Rise And Fall of Little Voice', 'The Memory of Water' and 'A Midsummer Night's Dream' amongst many others.

Away from the New Venture, Tim has directed for Bite Size at the Edinburgh Festival and designed productions all around the world including the musical 'The Life' currently playing at the English Theatre in Frankfurt and 'Let It Be' which is touring the UK.


