BE MY BABY

It's 1964 but the sixties aren't swinging for Mary Adams, 19-years-old, unmarried and pregnant. She is sent by her mother, intent on keeping up appearances, to St. Saviours, a Church of England mother-and-baby home in the North of England run by a formidable Matron.

Mary is set to work in the laundry and shares a dormitory with the tough-talking Queenie. Mary, along with other girls in the home, has to cope with the dawning realisation that she may well have to give up the baby for adoption, so she plots her escape.

The girls bond over their love of girl-groups of the times, such as the Ronettes and the Chiffons, and the music entertains, consoles and inspires them as they try to dance away their cares as the birth of their babies' approaches. When Mary finally gives birth to her baby she puts up a desperate fight to keep her child.

Despite all this, Mary and the other girl's youthful effervescence shines through so we share their laughter and tears as they dance their troubles away in this emotional and bitter sweet comedy.

The Playwright, Amanda Whittington, was exploring the plight of adopted children and wanted to write a play about them. But as she delved deeper, she felt herself needing to find out how it was for those teenage girls, coerced into giving up their child by social pressures, not really understanding the consequences of adoption and the emotional cost of giving up a child forever.

Uli and I are delighted to have such a talented cast, crew and production team who have the creativity and dedication to make this show a success.

We are sure you will catch the infectiousness of the girls' laughter and tears during the short time we share with them.

Elizabeth is an actor, musician, and writer. In 2014, she got involved with the Royal & Derngate in Northampton, taking masterclasses, assisting with shows, performances, and festivals there, and treading their hallowed boards with the Actors Company ensemble – last year in 'Great Expectations' and 'Grapes of Wrath'. Since moving back to her southern roots, Elizabeth performed stand up for the full run of Edinburgh Fringe 2018, and has enjoyed rehearsing with this cast for her first NVT performance. Elizabeth hopes to obtain professional representation and training, with which to develop and pursue an acting career.



Diane Robinson (Mrs Adams)

Diane has taught, performed and directed with a number of schools, youth groups and community companies, including some professional work, since graduating in Drama from University of London Goldsmiths' College.

Most recent acting roles include 'Calendar Girls' Wick Theatre Company, Ana in 'The Clean House', Mrs Elton in 'The Deep Blue Sea' and June in 'Impact Statement' for NVT and Benjamin in 'Animal Farm' for Brighton Little Theatre.

Diane has directed over 30 productions, both with young people, many of them with special needs, and also with adults. She directed Award winning 'Daisy Pulls it off' June 2015 and 'Brief Encounter,' October 2017 for WTC. She also directed 'Jumpy' for NVT in June of this year.

Rosie Blackadder (Queenie)

Rosie graduated from the University of Birmingham in 2014, with a degree in Drama and Theatre Arts. This is her first production at NVT, having recently returned to the UK from performing a comedy season at the Adelaide Fringe in Australia. Alongside performing, she has a keen interest in writing and directing. Previous roles include Jade in 'Motortown' (Simon Stephens), Doll in 'Playhouse Creatures' (April de Angelis) and directing credits include 'Abigail's Party' (Mike Leigh).
