BAD JEWS

It's a title that certainly grabs the attention. London Underground rose clurnsily to the bait when they refused to allow posters for the original UK production, fearing "widespread serious offence". They ended up looking rather silly when it was pointed out that the play had been (a) performed across the world to great acclaim for the last two years, (b) consistently praised for its integrity, and (c) awarded a 5-star review by the Jewish Chronicle.

The title is just a trick of words, to catch our interest and curiosity. The billboards for the original production also called it "a seriously smart comedy about family, faith, and legacy" - less eye-catching but a very fair description. The play does indeed pose lots of questions about competing claims as to what makes a 'good' or 'bad' member of any family, any religion or belief, any cultural background. But the great delight of this play is that it presents its questions so generously wrapped - in a massive helping of humour and daring comedy.

The action accelerates through 100 minutes "real time" (so no interval!) in a studio apartment in Manhattan, where our four young people are thrown together for the night, after the funeral of a beloved grandfather. All sorts of tensions and disagreements burst out, but the big battle is about which of the four most deserves to inherit a tiny item of the old man's jewellery - so tiny, but packing a huge significance for the family.

I love this play because it does the kind of things that only theatre can. We get extreme arguments, insults, embarrassments, sweary tempers and emotional meltdowns. We also get great flashes of humanity, insight and sympathy. But along with all that we get an almost unlimited licence to laugh - with the characters, and at the characters, and at all the situations they let themselves fall into. As with many of the finest plays, these elements work together as a complete "whole" - we get to think about some really serious stuff while we're having enormous fun and engagement with the characters, the humour and the action.

It's a work that struck me immediately as energetic, ambitious and young at heart. What better qualities to inspire the people involved in making a show - and hopefully to captivate the lovely people who come to see it! It's been more than 20 years since I directed at NVT and it's great to see close-up just how much has happened and developed over that time. And I can also see one sure thing that's remained constant - the commitment to create a quality theatre experience. It's been a delight working with such a talented young team of actors and with the many dedicated volunteers in the production team and in all areas of support for the successful running of NVT.

Chris Knight (Jonah)

This is Chris' fourth production at the NVT following on from his debut as Joey in *The Homecoming* (2017), various roles in *Lulu* (2017) and The Guard in *Antigone* (2017). He hopes to study at drama school this September.



Emmie Spencer (Daphna)

Emmie has appeared in several productions at the NVT since her debut in A Streetcar Named Desire in 2012. Recent roles include Hester Collyer in The Deep Blue Sea (2017), Fay McMahon in Loot (2016), and Ruth Ellis in The Thrill Of Love (2015)

Recent roles elsewhere include Lola in Broken Silence Theatre's Bug Camp (Winner of Best New Play at Brighton Fringe 2017) and Matron in Kasabian's One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest-inspired music video You're in Love with a Psycho (WIZ/Sony Music 2017).

Matthew Wyn Davies (Liam)

Bad Jews is Matt's third production at the NVT following his debut as Philip Welch in *The Deep Blue Sea* (2017) and various roles in *Lulu* (2017). Matt has taken acting classes at the Academy of Creative Training in Kemp Town, Brighton, as well as at the NVT itself



Sarah Drew (Melody)

Sarah trained at Bretton Hall in Theatre Acting and Music and has an MA in Scriptwriting from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth,

Theatre credits include Hero in Much Ado About Nothing, Myrtle in Tennessee Williams' Kingdom of Earth (Brighton Little Theatre) and Wife in Berkoff's Greek at Brighton Fringe Festival. Outside of the theatre, she divides her time between screenwriting, producing, and singing.



Bob Ryder (Director)

Bob has worked across Sussex as an actor and director for the last 30 years. His previous shows at NVT have been as director for Death and the Maiden (1996) and as actor in Moscow Stations (1997) Betrayal (2001) Woman in Mind (2011) and Broken Glass (2016).

He has also worked extensively at the Barn Theatre in Southwick (for Wick Theatre Company) and out in the fresh air at Worthing's Highdown Gardens (for Rainbow Shakespeare Company). Among the 30-odd productions Bob has directed locally, Shakespeare looms largest - and the other playwrights who crop up most are lbsen, Chekhov, Stoppard and the two Alans (Bennett and Ayckbourn). Next on the horizon is an acting role - as Prospero (The Tempest) this summer.

Joshua Harmon (Playwright)

Bad Jews wasn't Joshua Harmon's first play - but he says it was the first one to last for more than three nights! Written when he was still in his 20s, Bad Jews opened in Roundabout Theatre's 60-seater studio space in New York in 2012. It was then moved into their 400-seat main theatre the following year. And then it really took off.

From 2014 it has been performed widely across the USA and in various productions in Canada, Australia, Germany, Israel and South Africa. The UK premiere was at Bath's Theatre Royal in 2014 - and that production then had a long London run and UK tour (including a visit to Brighton's Theatre Royal in October 2015) before returning for another London run in 2016.

Harmon's next play, Significant Other, opened in New York in 2015 and was still playing on Broadway last year. A new play, Admissions, opened last month in New York - and a newly commissioned play, Skintight, is scheduled to premiere off-Broadway this summer.
