Laundry and Bourbon

LONE STAR

Double bill Laundry and Bourbon and Lone Star are two one-act comedies set in Maynard, Texas in the late 1970s. Opening on a baking hot afternoon, Laundry and Bourbon sees Elizabeth and Hattie reflecting on their high school days and what life in Maynard has dealt for them since. Elizabeth's husband Roy is missing and she's harbouring a secret, while Hattie, escaping her 'high-spirited' children, advises her best friend on how best to move forward. Enter Amy Lee with fresh gossip and news to send Hattie into a tail spin; bridge is on its way out and a new game is coming to town.

That same evening Lone Star sees war veteran Roy and his younger brother Ray sharing a few beers and some snacks out the back of Angel's bar. Still struggling to come to terms with how much life has moved on without him since serving, Roy relives former glories of his youth driving around in his 1959 pink Thunderbird convertible, while Ray hilariously struggles to relate to his brother's time in Vietnam. Enter Amy Lee's husband Cletis, who Roy hates with a passion, with a revelation that will severely test the brothers' relationship and shatter Roy's already uncertain world.

In Laundry and Bourbon and Lone Star, James McLure intertwines the lives of his colourful characters with wit, vigour and bitingly funny dialogue. While it would be easy to dismiss the inhabitants of Maynard and their small-town existence, this double-bill is a poignant observation of relationships in the shadow of the Vietnam War, which continues to resonate with audiences through its cleverly crafted look at life in the face of both domestic and national tragedy.

I've been so lucky to work with two incredibly talented casts with the support of an amazing backstage team. As an actor, I've always valued the "invisible people" who put so many hours and so much love into helping a production come to life, but as a director it has taken this appreciation to a whole new level. It is impossible to thank everyone, but I would like to show my gratitude to all those that have helped bring Laundry and Bourbon and Lone Star to the NVT stage: your hard work, advice and support have been greatly appreciated and without which I would have been lost.

We all, cast and crew, hope you enjoy the plays as much as we do.

Bryony Weaver (Assistant Director)

Bryony has been involved in over 54 productions of amateur dramatic and musical theatre since 1969. Main musical roles included Tzeitel in 'Fiddler on the Roof' (1993) and Peep-Bo in 'The Mikado' for TWAODS (1994), as well as chorus work in 'The Merry Widow', 'The Bartered Bride', 'Orpheus in the Underworld', 'Kiss Me Kate' and 'Cabarret'. For the profit-share ENR Productions, acting roles included Chorus Leader in Steven Berkoff's 'Agamemnon', Viola in 'Twelfth Night' and Hester in 'Equus', which she co-directed. Professionally, Bryony worked as a dresser for ENO in the early 80s, was PA to the Head of Opera at the National Opera Studio in 1986, PA to Steven Berkoff in 1993, and (having gained a PGCE in Drama) taught Drama at Lansdowne College, London, in 1996.

Bryony has been stage manager or crew at the NVT for: 'The Deep Blue Sea', 'Proof', 'Antigone', 'Anna Christie', 'True West', 'Jumpy', 'Be My Baby' and later this season, 'Pickwick & Weller'. She made her NVT acting debut in '1984', and was delighted to be asked to write a play for this year's Short Play Festival. This is her assistant director debut for the theatre.
