My first contact with Sarah Drew's play was one of supporting its writing through a work-shop process that allows the writer to actually see and hear their work as opposed to imagining the voices and visualising the scenes. That is actually the first step in the sometimes difficult 'letting go' process that a writer undergoes when the work he or she has created begins to take on a different form simply because a director and actors have started to 'act it out'. For Sarah this appeared to be the opposite, marvelling at the experience of seeing her words 'brought to life'.

From that point I was invited to take on the role of director. This meant taking the work through an audition process, on to a stage and then, through rehearsal, to the finished – if a piece of work can every really be thought of as 'finished' – play you'll see tonight.

On behalf of everyone involved I hope you enjoy the experience. For me it's been a delight to have worked with such a talented, exciting group of creative people. *Mark Wilson*

Sarah Drew (writer)

Sarah trained at Bretton Hall in Theatre Acting and Music and has an MA in Scriptwriting from the University of Wales, Aberystwyth.

She has acted in numerous plays at New Venture and Brighton Little Theatre and is also is a screenwriter. She is currently working on a feature film about despatch riders in WW1 and a TV series about Wimbledon in the early twentieth century. This is her first play.

Mark Wilson (director)

Mark has directed a number of plays both at NVT and other Brighton venues. These include *The Crucible, A View From the Bridge, A Streetcar Named Desire* and more recently, *Our Lady of Sligo*. He is also a writer, his play *You* winning the 2015 Brighton Festival Award for Theatre and The Fringe Review Outstanding Theatre Award as well as Play of the Week at the 2018 London Vault Festival. Match & Matrimony

Being a huge Jane Austen fan, it is an absolute pleasure to be directing (and acting in) Match & Matrimony.

Originally, the writer Judey Bignell was considering a much more provocative title where the second word was 'Countryside'. It's lovingly written Jane Austen parody it began as a two hour play with 20 characters and a number of anachronistic parody songs based on contemporary artists such as Meatloaf and Robin Thicke. It was strongly reminiscent of Pride & Prejudice, though with six daughters instead of five, all of whom had their own subplot and all of whom had their own object of love/heartbreak/frenzied lust. Obviously, for the purposes of the festival it had been scaled down somewhat, and it speaks of Judey's skill as a writer that this adaptation has lost none of the original's wit and romance, nor its wonderfully skewed presentation of Austen's characters and style. I'm absolutely delighted to be bringing this highly energised and hilarious piece to the NVT. Chris Gates

Judey Bignell (writer)

Judey graduated from the University of Sussex with a Master's degree in Creative and Critical Writing, for which her final dissertation was a full length version of *Match and Matrimony*, designed to be a Jane Austen parody musical. She is a director, writer and actor, and has written various other projects including an adult pantomime, murder mystery dinner performances, and several short plays for Cast Iron Theatre. *From A to B* (2013), her first short play, was a shortlisted finalist in the Worthing WOW festival.

Chris Gates (director)

This is Chris's third time as director. He adapted and directed a sell out production of *Woyzeck* in the 2018 Brighton Fringe, and he also directed *Ubu Roi*, which appeared in the Paris Dreams Before Dawn festival. He is currently directing a one man show for the Edinburgh festival called *Dancing In The Moonlight: A Play About Phil Lynott.* Chris graduated from The Academy Of Creative Training in 2016, and hopes to continue working in the arts until either he wins a BAFTA, or is able to steal someone else's.

James Bennison (Sam)

James has been on the stage since he was 11 years old and enrolled in Playbox Theatre Company in Warwickshire, both acting and performing comedy. Since then he has won the IYAF Brighton Fringe Stand Up Comedy Award, written and performed the hit children's show *Doktor James's Akademy Of Evil*, and has been involved with Cast Iron Theatre's short plays evenings and Most Curious Productions Brighton Fringe show *Hunters of Ghost Hall*.



Matt Davies (Father Andrew)

This is Matthew's fifth production at NVT following his role as Ray in Lone Star (2019).

Previous roles at NVT include Liam in *Bad Jews* (2018), Schwarz in *Lulu* (2017) and Philip Welch in *The Deep Blue Sea* (2017). Last year Matthew was Benjamin Braddock in *The Graduate* (2018) and Willoughby in *Sense and Sensibility* (2018) over at the Brighton Little Theatre.



Chris Gates (all the men)

When not too busy directing or writing, Chris has acted in a wide variety of roles, from classical and contemporary plays to devised theatre and improvisation; last year he performed a month-long stand-up show in the Edinburgh Fringe, and earlier this year he played Jake in *Further Education* at the Brighton Fringe. He last appeared at the NVT in *Anna Christie* in 2017. When asked to describe the experience of directing and acting in *Match and Matrimony*, Chris summed up the experience in two words, one of which was 'challenging'; the other is not suitable for publication.



Chris Knight (Sydney)

This is Chris Knights fifth production at the NVT. Previous credits include *The Homecoming* (2017), *Antigone* (2017), *Lulu* (2017) and *Bad Jews* (2018). Chris will be attending The Academy of Live and Recorded Arts from September for a BA Acting course.



Emma Lillie Lees (Evelyn)

Emma Lillie trained at East 15 Acting School and is a regular corporate and voiceover performer. She has performed in Fringe venues across London and Edinburgh and has appeared in numerous commercials, features and award nominated shorts. No stranger to Austen, she has written and starred in an adaptation of one of Austen's juvenilia works at The Soho Theatre and at The Theatre Royal Bath. This is her first appearance with NVT.



Justine Smith (Mrs Phelps)

Justine recently completed a two-year course at École Philippe Gaulier. Before that her performances include roles in *Cloud Nine* and *Picnic*, both directed by Scott Williams for the Impulse Company in 2015, and she has regularly performed at the Brighton Fringe.



Emmie Spencer (Elsa)

Emmie has appeared in several productions at the NVT, most recently as The Woman in *The Father* (2019), Bea in *Happy Now?* (2018), Daphna in *Bad Jews* (2018), and Hester Collyer in *The Deep Blue Sea* (2017). Recent appearances elsewhere include *Voices From Home* at the Old Red Lion Theatre, Islington (2018), Broken Silence Theatre's *Bug Camp* (Winner of Best New Play at Brighton Fringe 2017) and Matron in Kasabian's *One Flew Over The Cuckoo's Nest*-inspired music video "You're In Love With A Psycho" (Sony Music 2017).



Victoria Thomson (Amy, Kitty)

Victoria is making her debut at New Venture Theatre performing in two of the plays in the short play festival, *Hope that Plays a Tune Alone* and *Agency*. Her most recent performances include three roles in *Plaza Suite* for which she won Best Supporting Actress at the Arts Council Awards 2018 and Paulina in *Death and the Maiden* earlier this year. She is delighted to be involved with such a talented cast and crew for this festival and thrilled to be part of the New Venture family.
