'Hell must be a heart filled with unheard stories'

Set in the 1850s in the criminal wing of Bethlem asylum, this is a play about the birth of psychotherapy. It is the story of the struggle between those advocating traditional and quite Medieval treatment of the mentally ill and those struggling towards an understanding of the centrality of childhood experience and the curative value in articulating it — the curative value of talk. It is a play about stories, but more than that, it is a play about the universal and, indeed, timeless need to be heard.

'Talk' originally took the form of a radio play on BBC Radio 4. My redesign of the play for the stage has seen it produced in Canterbury and, more recently, at last year's Edinburgh Festival. Following this NVT production, it will be performed in Christchurch, New Zealand.

Aftermath.

Richard Dadd died of tuberculosis in January, 1886. He is buried in the cemetery at Broadmoor. His work now sells for thousands of pounds.

By the time of his death in 1870 at the age of only forty-six, Charles Hood's work had brought about a radical transformation to the treatment of the mentally ill, the hospital at Broadmoor being seen as leading the way in this area of medicine.

After his retirement from Bethlem in 1889, George Haydon was often recalled with fondness both by staff and inmates, many of them making reference to his 'talking with patients.' He died in 1891.

In 1900, Sigmund Freud published 'The Interpretation of Dreams' and the importance of the therapeutic encounter between therapist and patient — the importance of talk - became established.

As well as to my highly talented and very lovely cast and production team, my sincere thanks go to Gina Laline for her creative input at the inception of this project, and the magnificent support and Front-of-House network at NVT without whom this production and all of the others staged here would simply not have taken place - and you'd be sitting in an empty building.


