

THE FATHER

The Father portrays in a unique way how living with dementia feels; both for the father, Andre, as well as for his daughter and her partner. The daily challenges the condition creates are illustrated in this fascinating play through a variety of devices, constantly showing us the perspective of the affected person.

While the play is an acutely distressing portrait of dementia, it is by turns both humorous and moving. It shows Andre, while inhabiting a world of contradictions, capable both of a fierce lucidity and a senile cantankerousness.

The Father was first performed in Paris in 2012, the English premiere taking place in Bath in 2014. In 2015 it transferred to the West End, and was hailed as one of the most outstanding hits of recent years. It won ecstatic five-star reviews, and top listings in the Best Plays of the Year, winning awards in Paris, London and New York. The Times described it as 'a controlled unforgettable portrait of losing your mind', and The Guardian summed it up as 'a play that continually confounds expectations, and works almost like a thriller, with a sinister Pinteresque edge.'

I am very lucky in that I have a superb cast, led by Michael Bulman, and a terrific production team. Strat Mastoris has created an unsettling environment, echoing the state of Andre's mind. The rehearsal process has been both challenging and exciting, as collectively and individually we have faced and explored the feelings and issues that arise when caring for an elderly relative with dementia. The cast have come up with numerous good ideas about the portrayal of this illness, and they have been a pleasure to work with.

I hope Florian Zeller would be proud of what we've done; and that you, our audience, enjoy this great play as much as we have enjoyed working on it.

I would like to dedicate this production to the memory of my own father, a gifted and much-published poet, and the courage with which he faced the uncertainties of his last few years.

Michael Bulman - Andre

Most of Michael's performing experience has been as a singer, in offerings as diverse as Britten's 'Death in Venice', 'HMS Pinafore', Sondheim's 'Sweeney Todd' and 'A Little Night Music'. Indeed, he still performs with the Esterhazy Chamber Choir in Lewes.

He only started to act after reaching the age of 70, appearing with the Lewes Little Theatre as Henry Drummond in 'Inherit the Wind', Leonato in 'Much Ado About Nothing', Julius Caesar, and Charles Macklin in 'Mr Foote's Other Leg'. He has also been seen as the Narrator and Mysterious Man in Sondheim's 'Into the Woods' for LOS Musical Theatre.

For NVT he has previously played Dada in 'Our Lady of Sligo' and Billy in 'Lovesong'.



Lyn Snowdon - Anne

Lyn's most recent role at NVT was Mai in 'Our Lady Of Sligo'. She is delighted to once again be cast as Michael Bulman's daughter in an equally heartbreaking story. And no, Lyn is not actually eating chicken.

Mark Lester - Pierre

Mark has been back at the NVT for 2 years now. He has appeared in 'The Deep Blue Sea', NVT's award-winning 'Anna Christie' and 'Jumpy' and is very much looking forward to appearing in 'The Father'. He is excited by the prospect of working with yet more of the incredible talent at The New Venture.

He has just completed his directing debut at NVT, directing James MacLure's 'Laundry and Bourbon' and 'Lone Star', which was well-received and was a hugely enjoyable experience.

Simon Messingham - The Man

Simon Messingham returns to the NVT for the first time since 'Hughie' in 2017. He is a producer and writer by trade. Simon has acted in many shows at the NVT including 'The Winslow Boy', 'The Herbal Bed' and 'How Many Miles to Babylon'.

Marie Owens - Laura

Marie Owens first got involved in theatre in 2012 when she joined Bart Players in her native city of Belfast. There she got the chance to play several parts: killer maid, hot-tempered waitress, seductive spy, eccentric cook. Laura is her first part since relocating to Brighton. Mary Allen - Director

'The Father' is Mary's second production for the NVT, after directing 'The Real Inspector Hound' two years ago. For the last thirteen years she has also been directing musicals in Suffolk, working with large casts of amateurs and professionals. Mary spent the first three years of her working life as an actor, and thereafter spent the rest of her career working in various capacities in the arts. She says that when she first saw a production of 'The Father' it blew her away. 'The playwright describes it as a tragic farce, and it certainly has both of those qualities, as well as being a superb piece of writing.' She is thrilled to have the chance of directing it. 'I have a fabulous cast, who bring out both the humour and the despair.'


